

Projects for Creative Vision – Part 4

1. Creative – A Place You’ve Been Before
 - a. Visit a public place you’ve visited many times
 - *Choose a place that is very familiar to you, a place you like to be*
 - b. Photograph the place as if you were doing a travel blog
 - *Make at least one “establishing shot” to give a wide view of the place*
 - c. Try to capture the essence of the place in photography
 - *Use creative techniques to capture different perspectives on the place*
 - d. By Sunday, May 6, 5:00PM, submit three photos that tell the story of the place

2. Creative – A Place You’ve Never Been
 - a. Visit a public place for the first time
 - *Choose a place that is not familiar to you, a place you find interesting, but have never visited*
 - b. Photograph the location as if you were doing a travel blog
 - *Before you go, google the place and look for images taken there by other people*
 - *Make at least one “establishing shot” to give a wide view of the place*
 - c. Try to capture the essence of the place in photography
 - *Use creative techniques to capture different perspectives on the place*
 - d. By Sunday, May 6, 5:00PM, submit three photos that tell the story of the place

3. Creative – An Iconic Place
 - a. Visit an iconic place (even if you’ve been there many times)
 - *Everyone knows it when they see it. (e.g., a monument, a historic location, a sports stadium, a natural wonder)*
 - *The place has been photographed so many times that it’s hard to imagine coming up with a new perspective*
 - b. Photograph the location as if you were doing a travel blog
 - *Before you go, google the place and look for images taken there by other people*
 - c. Try to capture one common and one unique perspective
 - *Try to take some photos that mimic what you have seen before, and then look for a completely unique/creative image*
 - d. By Sunday, May 6, 5:00PM, submit two photos
 - *The first photo can be a standard shot of the place like other photos you’ve seen*
 - *The second photo should be something your unique/creative image*
